BRAZIL - LITERATURE TRANSLATION GRANT PROGRAM

Fundação Biblioteca Nacional announces that will offer grants with the purpose of supporting the translation of Brazilian authors to Brazilian and foreign book publishers wishing to translate, publish and distribute printed books and e-books of Brazilian authors, as well as of Brazilian publishing houses, abroad previously published in Brazil in Portuguese. This procedure, authorized by Executive Decision N° 28, will be regulated by the Announcement below.

Section I - Object

- 1. Brazil Literature Translation Grant 2°half 2010 intends to disseminate Brazilian culture and literature abroad. The Program confers translation grants upon Brazilian and foreign book publishers, with the purpose of supporting the translation of Brazilian authors. It is established by the Brazilian Ministry of Culture (MinC) through Fundação Biblioteca Nacional (FBN), General Department of Books and Reading (Coordenadoria Geral do Livro e da Leitura/CGLL), in connection with General Department of Research and Publishing (Coordenadoria Geral de Pesquisa e Editoração/CGPE).
- 2. Brazil Literature Translation Grant 2°half 2010 is offered to Brazilian and foreign book publishers wishing to translate, publish and distribute printed books and e-books of Brazilian authors, as well as of book publishers, abroad, previously published in Portuguese in Brazil.
- 3. Brazil Literature Translation Grant 2° half 2010 is open to the following genres: novel, short story, poetry, chronicle, reference work, children and/or teenage literature, literary essay, social essay, historical essay and anthologies of poems and short stories.
- 4. Applications in any language will be accepted whereas all the rules set in this Announcement are followed.

Section II - Budget Funds

5. An amount of R\$ 364.000,00 (BRL three hundred and sixty four thousand) shall be assigned for the promotion and selection process and for the translation grants of the Brazil – Literature Translation Grant 2°half 2010 Program.
